## Trainer's top tips: *SAGE Research Methods*

### Make sure you can access Secure Center to administrate your access

*SAGE Research Methods* is administrated using **Secure Center**, which sits on a separate website to the main platform. In Secure Center, you can download MARC records, pull usage reports, check your IP ranges, and manage off-campus access. You can also use Secure Center to control whether unavailable content in *SAGE Research Methods* is visible or invisible. For example, if you have not subscribed to a certain selection of content, by default this content will display with padlock icons; you can use Secure Center to make this content invisible when your patrons are browsing the platform or running searches.

### Check out our Discoverability Checklist

To make *SAGE Research Methods* as discoverable as possible, we index *SAGE Research Methods* content in discovery layers and mainstream search engines and send regular updates to ERM vendors. We also provide free MARC records, and we encourage librarians to list it in their A-Z and relevant subject listings, to ensure optimal discovery. ### Create a free profile to personalise the platform

By [creating a free profile](#) on the *SAGE Research Methods* platform, users can add resources to personal lists, save searches to easily run again in the future, and create customised video clips. Users can create a profile using the link at the top-right of the homepage of the platform, registering with an email address and password of their own choosing. We recommend all users create a free profile, especially faculty members and librarians who may want to share resource lists with their students.

### Use the content tiles and search bar to start discovering our content

With thousands of resources available in the complete *SAGE Research Methods* collection, it can take time for users to see how *SAGE Research Methods* can help them. Start introducing content to your users by exploring the resources via the *SAGE Research Methods* homepage: click through **content tiles** or add a keyword - linked to methods researchers are using, data types they're analysing, or key topics and themes related to their projects - to the **search bar** to find relevant content.

*SAGE Research Methods* contains unique content types designed to support varied teaching and learning aims. Our **Research Tools**, such as the **Methods Map** and **Project Planner**, can help to guide and support your users in their research.
